



MOUNTAIN POLICIES

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

- Ski or snowboard under control and in such a manner that you can stop or avoid others or objects.
- When proceeding downhill or overtaking others, You must avoid the person(s) below you.
- You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- When entering a trail or starting downhill, yield to others.
- Everyone shall use devices to prevent runaway skis or snowboards.
- You shall keep off closed trails and posted areas and observe all signs.

BACKCOUNTRY

If you leave the ski area boundary into the backcountry or re-enter the ski area from the backcountry, you must have all the following or you will lose your ski area privileges;

- Avalanche transceiver & demonstrated ability to use it.
- A partner
- Shovel
- Knowledge of terrain & your route
- Avalanche knowledge
- Knowledge of local avalanche conditions & forecast

You or your heirs will be charged for any rescue a minimum of: \$500
